

Learning spaces

Face-to-face learning space

The face-to-face learning space will include topic lectures, discussions and simulated activities to provide a broad understanding of the industry and best practice operations. Students will attend the face-to-face classroom learning in blocks 1 and 3. During this time the face-to-face classroom learning space will be open to students during weeks 1 to 4 and weeks 7 to 10 on Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday.

- Self-study 8.00am to 9.30am
- Face-to-face classroom learning 9.30am to 4.00pm.









Work placement learning space

This space allows students to apply their growing theoretical knowledge into practice. As a student, you will be treated like a member of the team and be expected to participate in routine duties as part of the centre's daily practices. You will be allocated a workplace supervisor to guide and mentor you during your placement and support the completion of the practical assessments required.

Students who are under 18 years of age will require a Statutory Declaration.


What you need

What to wear

Students will be interacting with parents, children, teaching staff and other educators. Dressing appropriately is important and shows commitment to professionalism. Students are required to wear the supplied polo shirt (one supplied, additional can be purchased for \$33), black work pants and enclosed shoes. A hat will be provided for the duration of the course.

Equipment Requirements

To ensure an optimal student experience, students MUST have a personal email address, access to a computer with internet connection and a printer, access to Microsoft office 2007 or equivalent, Adobe Reader X or equivalent, Web browser Chrome or Firefox. Students may also need access to a scanner as well as two large ring binder folders, plastic sleeves and a notebook.

How much does it cost?

Students may be eligible for subsidised training through the NSW Smart and Skilled programs. Fees may vary depending on individual circumstances. Students will be required to submit an eligibility declaration as part of the enrolment process. Fees will be determined using the Smart and Skilled calculator and provided prior to enrolment confirmation.

Who is eligible for fee-free* training?

To be eligible for fee free training, people must be

- 15 years old or over;
- No longer at school;
- · Living or working in NSW;
- An Australian citizen, Australian permanent resident, humanitarian visa holder or New Zealand citizen.

And be one (or more) of the following:

- Job seeker. This includes someone who is unemployed, on income support payments
 or expected to become unemployed (but there's specific criteria for construction –
 see below this list).
- Young person (including school leaver) aged 16-24, regardless of employment status
- NSW veteran and their recognised partner or spouse
- Any individual (including an employed person) seeking fee-free* training in specific full and part qualifications in:
 - aged care, childcare, disability care;
 - · digital skills; or
 - Training and Assessment (TAE).
